BBC Record Review on Nicholas Daniel

Nicholas Daniel is one of the world's leading oboists. He is the recipient of the 2011 Queen's Medal for Music, in recognition of his enormous musical contribution and passionate advocacy of his instrument. His interpretation of this virtuosic concerto will soar into King's College Chapel. Strauss wrote the oboe concerto in his Indian summer, in the aftermath of World War II, inspired by a liberated American oboist soldier. It is a masterpiece of rococo classicism and makes enormous demands on the player. Its themes flow rhapsodically, with an eloquent cantabile melody in the slow movement. This is a wonderful opportunity to hear an exceptional performer with the Philharmonia Orchestra.

Puccini's youthful *Messa di Gloria* prefigures his operatic writing in its powerful drama and lyrical themes. The extraordinary *Gloria* comprises over half of the work. The combined choirs and outstanding soloists, Andrew Kennedy and Mark Stone, with this preeminent orchestra will raise the roof in King's College Chapel.
