INTRODUCTORY NOTICES

ATTENDING CHAPEL SERVICES

WE warmly invite members of the public and the wider University to join us for our choral services. We enjoy the diversity of the congregations that gather day by day and are glad to welcome people of all faiths and none. Most services last at least three quarters of an hour, some longer—up to an hour and a quarter.

Most days, anything up to an hour before a service begins, a queue forms at the main entrance to College. Half an hour before the service, the College gate is opened and the queue moves forward. A quarter of an hour before the service, people are admitted to the Chapel itself. Five minutes before the service begins, the main gate of College is closed and, to ensure a calm and timely start to all our services, any who arrive later are not admitted.

Inside College there are three queues. The queue alongside the Chapel is the main one and is for members of the public. Members of the University are invited to queue on the north side of the Chapel. Only members and staff of King's College and School, and choir families, are invited to queue in front of the Gibbs' Building.

When you come to a service, please bear the following four points in mind:

- ✦ We ask you not to bring any bag that is larger than airline hand-luggage size.
- ✦ We ask that you take a seat in the Ante-chapel if you cannot commit to remaining for the whole service.
- ✦ We do not allow recording or photography of any kind in services and strongly request that phones be turned off.
- ✦ We regret that there are no public toilet facilities available in College.

If you or anyone attending with you has any additional needs with which we might be able to help you or if you have any other questions about attending, please contact the Chapel Manager, whose details are printed on page 2.

The initials KC in this booklet are used to designate membership of King's College.

from THE DEAN

THERE is a theology built into stone. The soaring verticality of this Chapel, with its fan-vaulted ceiling reaching upward as if the very structure were in the act of prayer, is not merely an aesthetic achievement. It is a confession of faith. Every arch, every pinnacle, every flood of light through the great windows speaks of a world charged with transcendence, of a creation that points beyond itself to its Creator. When you enter King's College Chapel, you do not simply step into a building; you step into a statement about the nature of reality.

Music makes the same statement but in a different way. Where stone arrests and fixes, holding its form across the centuries, music moves through time, unfolding phrase by phrase, drawing us forward into something not yet heard. And yet the two arts are more deeply kindred than they first appear. Both are ordered arts, governed by proportion and pattern, both deeply engaged with fundamental mathematical principles. Yet, both make beauty out of discipline. And both, at their most profound, do not draw attention to themselves but gesture outward, creating in the listener or the beholder a kind of holy restlessness. This is the ache that Augustine named when he wrote that our hearts are made for God, and find no rest until they rest in him.

In this Chapel, stone and song have been in conversation for five hundred years. The liturgy which fills these services is not a programme placed atop a neutral space; it is the space finding its voice. The choir's music and the Chapel's architecture are a single act of worship, each requiring and completing the other: the acoustics shaped to carry plainsong and polyphony, the rhythms of the liturgical year measured out in this particular light, against these particular walls.

We warmly welcome all who join us for worship this term, whether you come as members of College, as visitors to Cambridge, or simply as those who find themselves, perhaps unexpectedly, drawn in from the street. Whatever brings you here, we hope that in the meeting of music and stone, of time and eternity, you will find something that speaks to the deepest part of who you are.

You are welcome here.

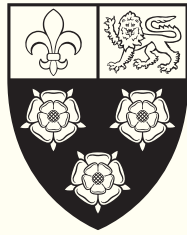
