5. Budget Update

The First Bursar presented a paper updating the Governing Body on our current financial position and plans for the future. The loss of rental income, the closing of the College to visitors, and the falls in the stock markets, have all had a major effect. The closure of the College has also led to some savings. Nonetheless, we expect the outcome to be about £1 million worse than planned in our budget. The position next year is very uncertain and the Finance Committee expect to have to make many adjustments to our budget through the year. It is clear that we will need to save money through reduced expenditure or increased income. We will try to do that without doing any lasting damage to the College . In particular, there are no current plans for redundancies although that may change if the financial pressures increase.

Congregation noted the losses expected in the current financial year and the plans for the budget for next year.

6. Update on current Building Projects

The Domus Bursar updated the Governing Body on the various planned building projects. The work on Old Garden Hostel, Cranmer Hostel and the drainage at Bodleys Court are due to resume as long as the contractors can do so safely and abiding by Government restrictions. The contractor engaged for the work on Keynes, the Wilkins Roof and the Bar had submitted a price far higher than originally proposed. Accordingly, the Buildings Committee do not recommend its acceptance. Instead, we will seek to do as much as we can of these works separately and within the agreed budgets.

The contractors will need to comply with Health and Safety requirements, especially over Covid-19. The contractors are fully committed and are working with us to ensure safety. The First Bursar confirmed that, if difficulties do arise, the College or the Health and Safety Executive could close the sites but would bear the legal responsibility for doing so.

Congregation agreed:

- a. To approve the refurbishment of Keynes moving to the Delivery Phase, subject to further tendering work and ensuring the project remains within the existing project cost (£6.4m) plus up to £400k in recognition of Covid-19 related expenditure (£6.8m to project completion).
- b. To approve the Hall roof replacement moving to the Delivery Phase, subject to further tendering work and ensuring the project remains with the existing project cost (£0.942m) plus up to £258k in recognition of Covid-19 related expenditure (£1.2m to project completion).
- c. To approve the College Bar improvements moving to the Delivery Stage (£1.134m to project completion).
- d. To approve the Gibbs' Building exterior conservation exiting the Portfolio.

7. Ex Chapel Panelling – Future considerations

The Governing Body decided that it would be useful to consider this matter further and, to see parts of the panelling in place in the Chapel. Accordingly, the vote was postponed until the next Congregation.

8. Intermission of Research Fellows – second reading

Congregation agreed, for the second time, the new Ordinance below on the intermission of Research Fellows:

A Research Fellow may, with the permission of the Research Committee, intermit their Research Fellowship for up to two years to pursue academic teaching or a research project elsewhere. A Research Fellow who is intermitting their Research Fellowship shall have the privileges associated with a non-resident member, except in such cases as Council makes a grant of additional privileges.

10. Quinquennial Inspection of the Chapel Fabric – Implementation of Recommendations

The Domus Bursar presented a paper to the Governing Body on the 2018 Chapel Quinquennial Inspection.
