## ***Principal Business***

### **39. Recognising Choral Potential**

*Governing Body was asked to note the challenges currently being experienced in recognising choral potential. The Admissions Tutor explained how this might be addressed by holding choral trials in September so that, when admission interviews are conducted, information on choral skills will be available.*

Congregation approved the initiatives to improve the admissions process for Choral Scholars, as outlined in this paper.

#### **40. Buildings Annual Report**

*The Domus Bursar summarised the plans for major building works over the next decade 2022 - 2031.*

*Detailed planning work for the projects to refurbish Spalding Hostel and re-roof the Chapel are proceeding well. A future Congregation will be asked to give final approval for the works to begin. While many other projects are being investigated, these are being delayed until the financial picture improves. Such delays will increase risk and may lead to higher costs.*

#### **41. Revision to Statute Q**

*The Provost presented revisions to Ordinance Q as part of the overall revision of the College Statutes. These had been seen and endorsed by Council. No amendment was proposed to Statute Q.*

Congregation agreed, by a two-thirds majority:

to approve for the first time the proposals in the paper for a new Ordinance Q

The approved Statutes and Ordinances are as follows:

#### **Statute Q (existing wording)**

#### **Q. DISCIPLINE OF MEMBERS *IN STATU PUPILLARI***

1. This Statute and any Ordinance made under this Statute shall be construed in every case to give effect to the following guiding principles, that is to say:
  - a. to enable the College to operate efficiently and effectively as a place of education, religion, learning and research;
  - b. to ensure that members *in statu pupillari* have freedom within the law to question received wisdom, and to put forward new ideas and controversial and unpopular opinions, without placing themselves in jeopardy of losing their membership of the College or privileges;
  - c. to apply the principles of justice and fairness.
  
2. All persons *in statu pupillari* shall:
  - a. observe the Statutes, and obey all Ordinances and Regulations and all other orders, instructions, rules or regulations as may from time to time be issued by a duly authorised Officer;
  - b. apply themselves diligently to their studies;
  - c. show due respect and obedience to the Provost, Council, the College Officers and any person charged with directing their studies;
  - d. pay the fees and charges due from them to the College when requested to do so; and
  - e. conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

3. If any person *in statu pupillari* shall fail to behave in the manner prescribed in Section 2 of this Statute, or shall act in a manner which is prejudicial to good order, the good name or the good governance of the College, the Council, or any College Officer so authorised by the Council, may impose such proportionate penalty on that person as the offence may in their judgement deserve.
4. The Governing Body shall specify by Ordinance the procedures for regulating and reviewing disciplinary decisions of College Officers, and of the Council. Such procedures shall afford the person subject to a disciplinary decision the right to a fair hearing and shall make provision, where the reviewing body considers it appropriate, for the original disciplinary decision to be quashed or a lesser or a greater penalty substituted.

### **Proposed Ordinance Q**

#### *Discipline of Members In Statu Pupillari*

1. The College's rules and procedures relating to student disciplinary matters are primarily set out in the Student Disciplinary Policy, available on the College Intranet and approved by the Council from time to time.
2. The rules in the Policy may be supplemented by rules in the Student Handbook (equally available on the College intranet) and by rules in other Policies of the College that specifically refer to a potential disciplinary consequence or where such a consequence is to be reasonably expected due to the nature of the breach of a College rule.
