56. Budget 2022-23

The First Bursar presented the draft budget prepared by the Finance Committee and approved by Council. The recovery in our income had not been as rapid as expected and we face significantly increased costs. That has led to a budget with a large deficit of $\pounds1,210,553$ and a longer period before we restore our endowment. Even this deficit assumes a quick return of income and stability in costs. Should that not happen, the College will need to seek immediate savings. It will also need to ensure that, in future, spending remains within that specified in the 5-year plan.

Dr Wallach spoke as chair of the Finance Committee. He thanked the First Bursar and Simon Billington, members of the Finance Committee and Heads of Departments for their work and co-operation in drawing up the budget and the 5-year plan, and the Development Office for protecting the College through its fund-raising efforts.

Congregation approved the budget for 2022-23 and the 5-year plan 2022-28 for recovery.

Congregation agreed that it would co-ordinate planning in the following areas to ensure that we can return to balanced budgets and fulfil our obligations as a charity.

(a) Assessing whether our income is recovering as required in the 5-year plan. If not, we will need to reduce expenditure to match the expected income.

(b) Determining the priorities within the Tutorial budget as we face difficulty in recruiting University Teaching Officers and lack the funds to recruit College Teaching Officers.

(c) Preparing detailed plans and costings to achieve carbon-neutrality.

Dr Wallach also proposed, and Congregation approved, the following vote:

Congregation thanked Dr Carne for his many and much appreciated contributions to the College especially during his fourteen years as First Bursar.

57. Decarbonisation of the College Estate

The First Bursar presented a Decarbonisation Report explaining what needed to be done to achieve carbon neutrality. This had been endorsed by Council.

Congregation agreed:

- (a) to note a King's College Decarbonisation Report, dated 31 May 2022,
- (b) to note further work on costing the extent of required remedial work to reduce reliance on fossil fuels, up to £40k, and to report such findings to the Sustainability and Buildings Committees, and
- (c) to bring a further report to Council and Governing Body, to include indicative programmes of work to meet the strategies outlined in the Decarbonisation Report.

58. K-Gates

This paper seeks Governing Body approval for projects to progress to the next stage. Council and the Buildings & Safety Committee have considered and endorsed these recommendations.

It was confirmed that the positioning of the photovoltaic panels would follow the plans and be below the ridge line of the Chapel roof.

Congregation agreed, subject to obtaining the necessary planning approvals:

- (a) To approve the Spalding Hostel refurbishment (£7.243m) and the Chapel roof replacement, including photovoltaic installation (£3.666m) moving to the Delivery Stage, and
- (b) To approve the Cranmer development and Bodley's Court roof replacement exiting the Portfolio.
