## ***Principal Business***

### **5. Report on Admissions (Deferred from Annual Congregation)**

*The Admissions Tutor provided a comprehensive report on admissions for the prior academic year, 2021-22. The College continues to perform well on key priorities and measures, but there is still more to do. Important issues include the ongoing effects of the pandemic and supporting students prior to and during the transition to higher education. The Admissions Tutor emphasised how valuable comments are from the wider Fellowship. In that spirit, a consultation will be forthcoming on options for the interview format, sent first to Directors of Studies and then to Governing Body.*

*Governing Body welcomed the report and wished the minutes to record a special note of thanks to the Admissions Tutor for her outstanding work and continued efforts in support of the College.*

### **6. Decarbonisation Update**

*The Domus Bursar presented a proposal for a detailed survey to identify the impact and cost of specific measures to decarbonise the estate, working building by building. This survey was set in the context of the University's stated ambition to reach net zero by 2038 and the College's desire to match this, at the least.*

Approved:

- a. To note a paper updating decarbonisation of the College estate,
- b. To bring a further report to Governing Body on the required programme of work to reduce demand on fossil fuels, and
- c. To note a target of 2038 to achieve net zero gas emissions across the College estate.

### **7. K Gates**

*The Domus Bursar updated Governing Body on projects due to move through K-Gates, with special focus on investigative work for Bodley's, Gibbs, and Chetwynd Court. Plans to restore the*

*Gatehouse would move towards detailed planning. Croft Gardens, Garden Hostel, and the Wilkins roof would all exit the portfolio. Decisions on K-Gates would be aligned with outcomes from the decarbonisation survey. Equally, existing projects such as the Spalding refurbishment already measures to improve energy efficiency and contribute to wider decarbonisation of the estate.*

Approved:

- a. Reforming of the Working Party and to identify priorities for an internal refurbishment of Bodley's Court, focus attention on future plans for an internal refurbishment of Gibbs to thermal improvements to the windows, and to identify costs associated with further work on the reduced Chetwynd Court scheme or other improvements to that area,
- b. Gatehouse roof repairs/replacement and stonework repairs/conservation project moving to the Detailed Planning Stage (£30k plus slate costs for next stage, and to note total project cost circa £613k),
- c. Croft Gardens moving to the Review Stage, and
- d. Gardens Hostel refurbishment and Wilkins Hall Roof projects exiting the Portfolio.
