- b. Agreed:
 - (i) Agreed to receive the report on the Harvard Social Studies programme at King's and to thank all those concerned, in particular Janet Luff and the Centre for History and Economics, for their part in making the programme a success in 2007/08.
 - (ii) Agreed to include the Harvard students from each year in the alumni network for the third-years of that academic year.
 - (iii) Agreed to appoint Dr Barber as Exchange Co-ordinator for 2008/09, and Dr Barber and/or Professor Vaughan (if willing) to serve as Directors of Studies for that year.
 - (iv) Agreed to appoint a Tutor for the students to be determined by the Senior Tutor.
 - (v) Agreed to establish the regulations for the programme in 2008/09 as in Appendix B, subject to minor amendments to be made at the discretion of the Exchange Co-ordinator in consultation with the Senior Tutor as needed.
 - (vi) Agreed to ask Professor Tuck of Harvard University to explore the possibility of sending up to four King's rising third-years for a September residency at Harvard in 2009 and/or 2010 and thereafter.
