Principal Items of Business

159. Buildings Gateway Report

The Domus Bursar presented an updated Buildings Gateway Report to Council. Council endorsed the new proposals as follows which will be presented to the Governing Body at its meeting on 4th May.

- a. To endorse the refurbishment of Keynes moving to the Delivery Phase, subject to further tendering work and ensuring the project remains within the existing project cost (£6.4m) plus up to £400k in recognition of Covid-19 related expenditure.
- b. To endorse the Hall roof replacement moving to the Delivery Phase, subject to further tendering work and ensuring the project remains with the existing project cost (£0.942m) plus up to £258k in recognition of Covid-19 related expenditure.
- c. To endorse the College Bar improvements moving to the Delivery Stage (£1.134m to project completion).
- d. To approve the External gates, Bodley's and Webb's installation of card access, Gardeners' Building, and replacement of boilers in King's Parade Projects moving to the Review Phase.
- e. To endorse the Gibbs' Building exterior conservation exiting the Portfolio.
- f. To approve the Rear Gate repairs project exiting the Portfolio.

The Domus Bursar was asked to provide plans of the proposed new bar to the Junior Members and to the Adornment Committee prior to the Governing Body Meeting.

Business for Report

160. Cambridge Half Marathon 2021

The Domus Bursar presented a request to stage part of the 2021 Cambridge Half Marathon Charity event through King's College.

Council agreed that the organisers of the annual Cambridge Half Marathon Event be allowed to make arrangements to proceed through King's College on Sunday, 7th March 2021, subject to detailed planning with the Domus Bursar, Head of Visitor Services, Head Porter, Dean's Verger and the Head Gardener. The race will take place on 7th March 2021 and will follow the same format as in 2020.

162. James Essay Prize & Winning Essay

The James Essay Prize was instituted in 1786 with a bequest from the Rev. Thomas James, Fellow and Tutor, for Undergraduates to submit an essay, of between 2,000 and 4,000 words choosing from a list of titles devised by the judges.

There were 5 entries this year for the James Essay Prize and Cecily Bateman was awarded £425 as 1st Prize for her entry entitled 'What is death?' A copy of her essay will be placed on the intranet.

163. John Rose Prize

The John Rose Prize is in memory of Dr Charles John Rose (KC1963) for the "best explanation of a scientific principle of general interest".

There were 12 entries for the John Rose Prize and the winning essays were:

First place:

Emelyn Rude £500 (*Golden Delicious: the Decadent Paradox of the Maillard Reaction*)

Joint second place:

Yutong Chen £250 (*Shadow from a high dimensional world*)

Toh Qin Kane £250 (*Know Thy Genetic Enemy: The Strategy of the Coronavirus*)
