15. Oral Reports

USS Consultation

The Provost reported that, at an informal meeting of the Fellowship, it had been agreed that no comment should be made on the consultation about contingent contributions to USS.

King's Parade

The First Bursar reported on plans to impose an experimental traffic order closing King's Parade to motor vehicles. Discussion with the City and County Councils are expected and, once further information is available, it will be reported to the Governing Body.

Principal Business

16. Staff Salaries

The First Bursar presented a report on the salary levels for casual staff. The Personnel Committee reports to Council and recommends that all permanent staff are paid at or above the wage level recommended by the Living Wage Foundation. The situation with casual staff is more difficult and the Personnel Committee would consider this anew in the light of the comments made by Fellows. It was suggested that the Personnel Committee should report to Congregation annually and, as chair of that Committee, the Provost agreed to do so.

Other Business

17. Chapel Lighting

The Dean presented a report on the trials in lighting the Chapel. The replacement of the lighting rig in the antechapel had been particularly successful but the lighting elsewhere had helped members of the congregation to read orders of service.

Congregation agreed:

- (a) Orchestra lighting in bays 4 and 5 should be retained and the old lighting rig removed.
- (b) The uplighters in bays 9 and 12 should be removed.
- (c) Lights in bay 12 should be retained as they provide enhanced lighting to the altar and the Rubens, with lamp holders being replaced with smaller lights.
- (d) The number of lights in bay 9 should be reduced by two.
- (e) The remaining bays should be fitted with a reduced number of lamps (bays 1,2,7,8,10 and 11 with four lamps, and bays 3 and 6 with three lamps).

18. Chetwynd Court

The Domus Bursar invited the Governing Body to consider taking forward certain parts of the Chetwynd Court development in 2020. This would enable us to order later works better and the disruption would be no greater than for the planned works to the Hall roof. It would, however, mean that the College would bear the costs without having obtained philanthropic support.

A decision on this may be delayed until the first congregation of the Easter Term. Congregation agreed to this delay.

19. Buildings Gateway Review

The Domus Bursar presented an update on the buildings portfolio. The major changes were:

(a) Chetwynd Court

Under item 18, a decision was delayed until the Easter Term.

(b) Croft Gardens

To note that Council had agreed that £130,000 for this project, already approved, may be used to prepare detailed planning for critical aspects of the scheme.

(c) Chapel Lighting

This was approved under item 17 above.

(d) Fountain

To approve the refurbishment of the fountain moving to the Planning Stage. The expected costs are £34,000, half of which will be met by a donation. (This was reported to the Governing Body because of the Page 3 of 4 interest it aroused, even though the costs only require Council approval.)
