#### 24. Oral Reports

#### **Chapel Wood - Working Party**

The Provost reported that a Working Party had been established by Council to consider the future use of the woodwork removed from the Chapel. This is now in storage, where it will remain for the next year.

#### Update on the work of the Gold Team over the last 3 months

A summary of the work of the College's Silver and Gold teams had been circulated to Fellows.

The Senior Tutor reported on educational matters. Since the closure of the University, most students had left. About 30 undergraduates and a similar number of graduates remain. A few Research students are beginning to return as departments open. He thanked Directors of Studies for their efforts to arrange supervisions and online support. The first assessments had taken place and a second opportunity would take place between  $7^{th}$  and  $25^{th}$  September.

The First Bursar reported on the College's operation. Safety has been a key concern, with risk assessments for all returning staff. Many members of staff have been able to work from home. Those who cannot, have been furloughed and will return gradually as the need arises. We are also working closely with the University and other Colleges. Major, shared concerns at the moment are accommodation for returning students; the need to support the poorest Colleges; and planning for the future. The

Recovery Task Force is looking at four scenarios and planning how to deal with each.

#### **Principal Business**

## 25. Budget 2020-21

The First Bursar presented the budget on behalf of the Finance Committee and Council. The budget is based on a fairly optimistic outlook, with a gradual return to full operation. That may need adjustment during the financial year. If the situation deteriorates, we will need to make adjustments, either through increasing income or reducing costs. Council was, however, anxious not to make changes that would be damaging and difficult to reverse if they can be avoided. Council intends to consider its strategy in dealing with more extreme scenarios and what its priorities should be.

Some Fellows thought the budget was too optimistic. The pandemic could lead to an existential risk to some universities and colleges. We might need to sell assets, such as our works of art, to restore our endowment. If further, major changes are required, Council will make proposals to the Congregation.

The Finance Committee and Heads of Department were thanked for their help in preparing the budget

Congregation approved the budget for 2020-21 proposed by Council.

## 26. Croft Gardens – re-development project ready to proceed to Construction

The Domus Bursar presented the proposal to appoint Gilbert Ash as the main contractor for the construction at Croft Gardens. There was concern about the safety of proceeding during the pandemic but the site is isolated and contractors are accustomed to managing risks.

Congregation approved the redevelopment of the Croft Gardens site moving to the Delivery Stage (£22m total project cost).

# 27. Proposal to adjust the timings of King's Scheme for student research in slavery

Professor Austin, Dr Foks and Professor Osborne asked Governing Body to allow the extension of the scheme to encourage research into King's historic links with slavery through the academic year 2021/22, with the final report being due in Michaelmas 2022. Thereby in effect postponing the resumption of expenditure, and the final report, by one year.

Governing Body agreed that the scheme should be extended through the academic year 2021 / 22 with the final report due in Michaelmas 2022

#### Routine papers (for report only)

### 28. Buildings – Annual Report

The Domus Bursar presented a paper summarising the plans for major building works over the next decade 2020 - 2029.

Concern was expressed about builders increasing the risks of infection. All contractors were required to follow safety regulations. As far as possible, access would be by separate and isolated routes. The work on the bar and Keynes will be complete before most students return. It was also suggested that projects be delayed until there is greater certainty about the course of the pandemic. For existing projects that would be both expensive and leave us with unfinished work. The Buildings Committee and Congregation should, however, consider carefully whether to proceed with projects that are at the planning stage. They will report to Congregation.

The report was received.

#### 29. Any Other Business

In view of the current challenges, it was agreed to set dates for additional Congregations in August and September. Informal meetings of the Fellowship to discuss particular matters raised by Fellows should also be arranged.
