57. Oral Reports

Covid-19 Update

The First Bursar and Senior Tutor commented on actions arising from the pandemic. In particular, the College Officers are looking at the restrictions that may be required if cases increase. After some initial issues, students have reacted well and abided by the covenant aimed at protecting the community. A summary was circulated to the Governing Body.

All those in the College who had prepared so well and made such good arrangements for the return of undergraduates and for their education and continued well-being in residence were thanked.

Principal Business

58. Delegation of Powers

The Provost withdrew the paper on the delegation of powers so that it could be considered and discussed further. There was a need for rapid decisions to be made in current circumstances. For example, the Vice-Chancellor and Public Health England will ask Heads of House on Friday to confirm that they can take necessary decisions within a day. There were, however, different ways in which this could be managed. Until that is agreed, Statute D.2 grants powers to the Provost to act provided that it is consistent with the Statutes and Ordinances.

A number of points were raised for future discussion. We should only make decisions during the current crisis when they are essential. We might consider what sorts of emergencies might arise and how we would deal with them. A separate policy on this might be an alternative to changing Ordinances.

59. Spalding Hostel – Update and permission to proceed to RIBA stage 2

The Domus Bursar provided an update on progress of the Spalding Hostel refurbishment project, and sought approval to proceed to RIBA Stage 2.

A number of Fellows argued that the College should not commit to this project while the financial circumstances were so uncertain. There is no commitment to the full project at this stage but the planning that is being agreed will allow it to proceed in 2022 or whenever the Governing Body is ready to give its approval. It was therefore agreed to remove the reference to 2022 in the vote.

It was suggested that for this project and all other future student accommodation, the College and their contractors and architects take into consideration the lessons learned from COVID in terms of 'household size' and facilities for access, sanitation and social space so that our facilities are better able to cope in the event of future mass student self-isolation.

Agreed:

- (a) To accept a paper recommending further investigation into the future refurbishment of Spalding Hostel, and
- (b) To approve expenditure of £125k in support of RIBA Stage 2/K Gates Investigation Stage.

60. Buildings Gateway Review

The Domus Bursar presented a paper seeking approval for projects to progress to the next stage, following endorsement from Council and the Buildings & Safety Committee.

Agreed:

- (a) To approve the Spalding hostel refurbishment proceeding to the Investigation Stage (£125k RIBA2 costs), and
- (b) To approve the Chapel Lighting, Bodley's roof replacement and Cranmer Development proceeding to the Review Stage.

Routine papers (for report only)

61. Chapel Lighting Installation

The Domus Bursar provided an overview of the work to install the internal lighting in the Chapel between May – August 2020.

The project had reached this stage after significant planning, a number of trials, due consideration by a number of Committees, Council and Governing Body. The Governing Body agreed a vote of thanks to the College Consultant Benedict Cadbury, NRM who worked tirelessly on the project.

The Domus Bursar confirmed that the Project is now ready to move into the Review Stage of the K Gates Portfolio, where benefits will be tracked and costs finalised. A further report will be made before this project exits the Portfolio.
