CHORAL SERVICES

Services are normally sung by King's College Choir from Tuesdays to Sundays and on Mondays by King's Voices, the College's mixed voice choir. Any exceptions are listed.

ORGAN RECITALS

Each Saturday during term time there is an organ recital at 6.30 p.m. until 7.15 p.m. Admission is free, and there is a retiring collection.

On 27 January the recital is dedicated to the memory of Donald Parry, Fellow 1948–2006. On 10 February Prime Brass are joined by the two organ scholars in a programme for organ and brass, and for 24 February Gerald Gifford has devised a sequence of Bach harpsichord concertos which will be accompanied by a small string ensemble.

STANFORD CELEBRATION

At Evensong on Saturday and Sunday 10 and 11 March the music of Stanford is featured as part of a weekend celebration of the music of this composer, organised jointly by the Stanford Society and the Cambridge University Music Society. Stanford was Professor of Music in the University and Conductor of CUMS, and a plaque in his honour will be unveiled during this weekend by the present Conductor of CUMS, Stephen Cleobury.

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SERVICES

This year sees the third festival of music for Holy Week and Easter, in which a series of concerts complements the traditional services. Details of the concerts and how to book tickets appear later in this booklet.
