CHORAL SERVICES

Services are normally sung by King's College Choir on Sundays and from Tuesdays to Saturdays. Services on Mondays are sung by King's Voices, the College's mixed voice choir. Any exceptions are listed.

ORGAN RECITALS

Each Saturday during term time there is an organ recital at 6.30 p.m. until 7.15 p.m. Admission is free, and there is a retiring collection. There is no recital on 24 November.

MUSIC

On Saturday 6 October, the organ recital is given in memory of Dr William Balfour. On Sunday 4 November, the Dante Quartet, the College's resident string quartet, joins the Choir at the Sung Eucharist. On Remembrance Sunday, 11 November, the Choir will give the first UK performance of *Requiem: A thanksgiving for life* by Sir Philip Ledger, formerly Director of Music. Sir Philip will conduct. On Friday 16 November, a concert of music by Elgar, the 150th anniversary of whose birth is celebrated this year, inaugurates the new 'Concerts at King's' series which will complement the Easter at King's Festival. The following day, Sir David Willcocks, formerly Organ Scholar and Director of Music, conducts the Choir at Evensong.

ILLUSTRATIONS

This term's 'Angel' illustrations are reproduced from photographs taken by Richard Lloyd Morgan.

Cover: An angel playing a lute from the 'Madonna and Child in the Rosary' altarpiece in St Edward's Chapel, c.1500, by Gert van Lon (Westphalia).

September: A trumpeting angel adorns the 17th century organ case.

October: An angel in the stained glass windows of the Whichcote Chapel, c1500.

November: A stone angel playing the lute on the porch of the south door.

December: A winged and clawed angel brings a 'Caution Against Heresy' from a stained glass window in the vestry, c1490, Cologne (Westphalia).

CAROL SERVICES

The PROCESSION FOR ADVENT is mainly intended for members of the College but seats may be available for those who are prepared to queue. Those for whom a seat can be found will be admitted at 5.40 p.m.

The CHRISTMAS EVE CAROL SERVICE is primarily intended for the City of Cambridge and the general public. Apart from those reserved for members of College and their guests, seats are kept for those who are prepared to queue. Normally anyone joining the queue before 9.30 a.m. will gain admission, but it is not guaranteed that this will be so. The queue is admitted at 1.30 p.m. The service begins at 3.00 p.m. and ends at about 4.30 p.m. We advise that this service is not suitable for young children.

Carols are sung at the SUNG EUCHARIST on Christmas Day. The service begins at 11.00 a.m. and ends around 12.30 p.m. After places have been kept for members of the College and their guests, visitors will be welcomed, as at all the regular choral services throughout the year.
