81. Oral Reports

Covid-19 Update

The College has continued to adopt rules based on risk assessments. The asymptomatic testing of resident students has restarted. So far, there have been no positive cases at King's College but participation has been low. There is concern across the University that the testing may be ineffective unless participation increases and the costs are considerable. A few students have tested positive on arrival and have isolated. The student body has been appreciative of events organised in College and have generally behaved well and respectfully.

Update on Anthony Gormley Statue

The Keeper of the College Collections reported that, despite delays, there had been progress on the planning application for the statue of Turing. She had met with the Chief Planning Officer and many City Councillors to inspect the possible sites. She was encouraged to submit a planning application, for the site outside the library arcade, and a public benefit statement.

Principal Business

82. Statutes – background paper

The Provost proposes to revise the College Statutes and this paper is the first of a number addressing this issue.

Congregation agreed that:

- (i) All proposed revisions will be presented to, and voted on by, the Governing Body at a Congregation. A two-thirds majority of those present and voting will be required to take the revision to the next stage. There will be the opportunity for amendments to be made to the proposals.
- (ii) At the conclusion of this process all Statutes whose revision has been approved as in (i) above will be presented at a special meeting in conformity with the Oxford & Cambridge Act 1923, to be passed by a two-thirds majority for onward transmission to the University for approval and then to the Privy Council.

83. Statutes – revision A, B, C & D

Specific proposals were made to revise Statutes A, B, C, and D together with the corresponding Ordinances and Regulations. These were discussed and approved subject to amendments that were agreed and are listed below.

The principal matters discussed were as follows and were all agreed without dissent.

- 1. Congregation approved the proposed changes to Statute A subject to a confirmatory vote at a special Congregation.
- 2. Congregation approved for the first time the proposed amendments to Ordinance A.1.
- 3. Congregation approved the proposed changes to Statute B as amended subject to a confirmatory vote at a special Congregation.

There was concern that Statute B.1.c might allow a major change in the structure of the Governing Body without change of Statutes. That was not the intention and so it was agreed:

The number of persons admitted to the Governing Body under the proposed Statute B.1.c should be limited to four.

There was also discussion about Statute B.6 specifying the number of Fellows required to call an Ordinary Congregation. On balance it was felt that this should not be a large number so that concerns known only to a small part of the Fellowship could be raised when necessary. This would always be an exceptional procedure.

The number of members of the Governing Body required to call an Ordinary Congregation under proposed Statute B.6 should remain at twelve.

- 4. Congregation approved for the first time the proposed amendments to Ordinance B.1 and B.2 subject to the clarification noted below.
 - In Ordinance B.1.5, former Life Fellows may be co-opted onto committees, except for Council and the Research Committee.

- 5. Congregation approved the proposed changes to Statute C subject to a confirmatory vote at a special Congregation.
- 6. Congregation approved for the first time the proposed amendments to Ordinance C.1 and C.2 subject to adding the Visitor Committee to the list in Ordinance C.2.2.
- 7. Congregation approved the proposed changes to Statute D subject to a confirmatory vote at a special Congregation;
- 8. Congregation approved for the first time the proposed amendments to Ordinance D.1.
- 9. Congregation confirmed agreement to the Statement of Practice previously approved by the Governing Body.
