#### ATTENDING CHAPEL SERVICES

We warmly invite members of the public and of other colleges in the University to join us for almost all our choral services. Our services are open to people of all faiths and none, and we enjoy the diversity of the congregations that gather day by day.

Most days, anything up to an hour before a service begins, a queue forms at the main entrance to College. Half an hour before the service the College gate is opened and the queue moves forward. A quarter of an hour before people are admitted to the Chapel itself. Five minutes before the service begins, the main gate of College is closed and, to ensure a calm and timely start to all our services, any who arrive later are not admitted.

Inside College there are three queues. The queue alongside the Chapel is the main one and is for members of the public. Members of the University are invited to queue on the north side of the Chapel. Only members and staff of King's College and School, and choir families, are invited to queue in front of the Gibbs Building.

When you come to a service, please bear the following five points in mind:

- \* We ask you not to bring any bag that is larger than airline hand-luggage size.
- We ask you take a seat in the Ante-chapel if you cannot commit to remaining for the whole service. For Evensong allow up to an hour; for Holy Eucharist an hour and a quarter.
- We do not allow recording or photography of any kind in services and strongly request that phones be turned off.
- \* We regret that there are no public toilet facilities available in College.

If you or anyone attending with you has any special needs that we might be able to help you with, or if you are coming in a group of ten or more people and wish to be seated together, or if you have any other questions about attending, please contact the Chapel Manager, whose details are printed on page 4.

# from THE DEAN

Easter Term in King's College Chapel brings a lively and inspiring series of special occasions, as well as the regular daily services.

On the day of the King's Coronation we will have no service in the Chapel, but the following afternoon we will mark this important, happy and holy occasion with a special Choral Evensong.

On Sunday 14 May we welcome alumna Nicola Reindorp back to King's to give the *Sermon Before the University*, the title of which this year is 'Faith in Doubt'. Nicola studied Social and Political Sciences here in the 1990s and has worked on international relief and peacemaking. She is currently Chief Executive of *Crisis Action*.

David Briggs' life spanned more than a century and he served the Chapel as chorister, choral scholar, and Master over the Choristers. He was Headmaster of King's College School from 1959 to 1977. We will remember him at Evensong on Sunday 21 May with an address by former chorister, choral scholar and member of the King's Singers, Bob Chilcott.

Other great occasions this term include Evensong sung jointly with the choirs of Trinity College on Tuesday 2 May and St John's College on Tuesday 4 July. We will especially welcome pupils, parents, staff and governors of King's College School on Friday 12 May and, as is customary, will commemorate our Founder, Henry VI, with a requiem and the ceremony of roses and lilies on Friday 19 May, which is the Friday nearest to the anniversary of his death.

Our visiting preachers this term include Professor Jeremy Begbie on Whit-Sunday and the Dean of Pembroke on St Barnabas' Day. Professor Catherine Pickstock, Norris—Hulse Professor of Divinity, will make her contribution to our Matins series of sermons 'What is Truth?' on Sunday 21 May.

Finally, please note that as our service on Wednesday 14 June will be broadcast live on BBC Radio 3, it will begin at 4.00 pm, and we will not admit people to Chapel after 3.55 pm.

#### Organ recitals

This term we return to our weekly format of Sunday organ recitals at 2.30 pm, before Evensong. In addition to the home-team, it is a pleasure to welcome back former organ scholar Ian Hare, Dr Martin Ennis from Girton College, Katelyn Emerson from Gonville and Caius College, Sarah Baldock and Katherine Dienes-Williams. Admission to these recitals is free and all are welcome, as well as to the service immediately following them.

#### Music

There are two occasions this term when we shall welcome other Cambridge choirs to Chapel. On Tuesday 2 May, Stephen Layton, organ scholar at King's from 1985–89, will bring the choir of Trinity College, in this, his final term as Director of Music; and on Tuesday 4 July we will welcome Christopher Gray and the choir of St John's College, in this, his first term as Director of Music. King's College Choir renews its very old and long-standing relationship with The Bach Choir in a performance of Elgar's *The Dream of Gerontius* on 13 June, recorded 'as-live' by BBC Radio 3. The BBC will stay on to broadcast *Choral Evensong* live on Radio 3 on Wednesday 14 June; please note the earlier-than-usual start-time for this service. As has been tradition, departing choral scholars and choristers have been invited to request the music for the final weekend of the choral year.

King's Voices sings weekly on Wednesdays, under the direction of Ralph Woodward; they will also sing on Tuesday 30 May during the School half-term holiday. On Sunday 14 May they will join King's College Choir to sing for the *Sermon before the University*; both Choirs will combine as usual for the College's May Week Concert on Monday 19 June.

The membership of King's College Choir changes every year. If you would like to know more about being a member of the Choir, or to hear about life as a Chorister, Choral Scholar or Organ Scholar, please contact me by email to begin an informal exploration.
