ATTENDING CHAPEL SERVICES

We warmly invite members of the public and of other colleges in the University to join us for almost all our choral services. Our services are open to people of all faiths and none, and we enjoy the diversity of the congregations that gather day by day.

Most days, a queue begins to form at the main gate of the College on King's Parade and is welcomed into the College grounds half an hour before the service begins.

Inside College there are three queues. The queue alongside the Chapel is the main one and is for members of the public. Members of the University are invited to queue on the north side of the Chapel. Only members and staff of King's College and School, and choir families, are invited to queue in front of the Gibbs Building.

When you come to a service, please bear the following five points in mind:

- ✦ We ask you not to bring any bag that is larger than airline hand-luggage size.
- ✦ We ask you to be in good time as we do not admit people to Chapel after a service has begun.
- ✦ We ask you take a seat in the Ante-chapel if you cannot commit to remaining for the whole service. For Evensong allow up to an hour; for Holy Eucharist an hour and a quarter.
- ✦ We do not allow recording or photography of any kind in services and strongly request that phones be turned off.
- ✦ We regret that there are no public toilet facilities available in College.

If you or anyone attending with you has any special needs that we might be able to help you with, or if you are coming in a group of ten or more people and wish to be seated together, or if you have any other questions about attending, please contact the Chapel Manager, whose details are printed on page 4.

INTRODUCTORY NOTICES

from THE DEAN

Sung services begin on Tuesday 17 January and continue every day, except Mondays, until Friday 17 March. We will also have choral services from Maundy Thursday to Easter Day.

Sermons and addresses are offered on Sunday mornings and a short homily is given at some of our weekday communion services. Most of these are given by the Dean or Chaplain, but this term we will also hear from the Master over the Choristers, Mrs Yvette Day. Visitors from elsewhere in Cambridge will be The Revd Jennifer Totney of Westcott House, and The Very Revd Professor David Fergusson, Regius Professor of Divinity. The Dean of Chapel of Jesus College, The Revd James Crockford, will preach on Maundy Thursday. At our two services of Matins this term we continue our exploration of Pontius Pilate's question 'What is Truth', with contributions from two Fellows of King's: Dr Perveez Mody (Social Anthropology) and Professor Anna Alexandrova (Philosophy of Science).

Every Wednesday other than Ash Wednesday the service will be sung by King's Voices. As in Michaelmas Term, the second reading will be from the works of Dr Martin Luther King Junior.

On Wednesday 15 February there will an address on the theme 'Religion and Enterprise' given by Fellow Benefactor Malcolm McKenzie. Malcolm studied at King's from 1977–80 and currently supports initiatives in the Entrepreneurship Lab, which he co-founded in 2021. The *e-Lab* helps our students develop entrepreneurial, venturing and business skills so they can explore the world of start-ups, scale-ups, digital, business and social innovation. This takes the form of education, mentorship and experience, providing skills that can create enterprises with both market and social impact. In part prompted by the death last June of his father, Ian—also a Kingsman—Malcolm has been reflecting on how the values of practical entrepreneurialism, business and commerce relate to ethical questions, as well as to spiritual and religious purposes and commitments. His address will be of interest to all who seek to make a real difference in the world through the innovative application of knowledge and skill in the market, together with the sense of responsibility that comes alongside spiritual and religious values.

Next term, Sunday services will begin with the *Sermon Before the University* on 30 April. We intend also to remember with thanksgiving the life of David Briggs, former Chorister, Choral Scholar and Headmaster of King's College School, at Evensong on Sunday 21 May. Former pupils and all admirers of David will be most welcome.

ORGAN RECITALS

This term we will host four organ recitals on Sundays at 2.30 pm, directly before Evensong. Daniel Hyde, Director of Music, will investigate movements from J.S. Bach's 18 'Leipzig' Chorales on 12 February and 12 March; Paul Greally, organ scholar, will present two contrasting programmes on 29 January and 26 February. Admission to these recitals is free and all are welcome, as well as to the service immediately following them.

MUSIC

This term we are delighted to welcome the internationally acclaimed viol consort *Phantasm* to accompany the Choir at Evensong on 5 February. They will return on Easter Day to accompany the Choir in William Byrd's 'Great' Service; this will be the first of a number of occasions planned throughout the year when we will celebrate the 400th anniversary of Byrd's death. On both dates, *Phantasm* will also give a short recital later in the evening in Chapel, in front of the Rubens altarpiece. For the first time since 2019, we are delighted to see a return to the schedule of the Foundation Concert on 18 March. The Holy Week and Easter Festival returns once again in early April. Details of all forthcoming concerts can be found on page 30.

King's Voices sings weekly on Wednesdays, under the direction of Ralph Woodward; they will also sing on Tuesday 14 February, during the School half-term holiday. To celebrate International Women's Day on 8 March, King's Voices sings a special service including powerful readings and a selection of music by female composers spanning many centuries.

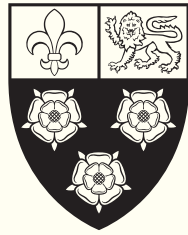
EASTER *at* KING'S
