### ATTENDING CHAPEL SERVICES

We warmly invite members of the public and of other colleges in the University to join us for almost all our choral services. Our services are open to people of all faiths and none, and we enjoy the diversity of the congregations that gather day by day.

Most days, a queue begins to form at the main gate of the College on King's Parade and is welcomed into the College grounds half an hour before the service begins.

Inside College there are three queues. The queue alongside the Chapel is the main one and is for members of the public. Members of the University are invited to queue on the north side of the Chapel. Only members and staff of King's College and School, and choir families, are invited to queue in front of the Gibbs Building.

When you come to a service, please bear the following five points in mind:

- \* We ask you not to bring any bag that is larger than airline hand-luggage size.
- \* We ask you to be in good time as we do not admit people to Chapel after a service has begun.
- \* We ask you take a seat in the Ante-chapel if you cannot commit to remaining for the whole service. For Evensong allow up to an hour; for Holy Communion an hour and a quarter.
- \* We do not allow recording or photography of any kind in services and strongly request that phones be turned off.
- \* We regret that there are no public toilet facilities available in College.

If you or anyone attending with you has any special needs that we might be able to help you with, or if you are coming in a group of ten or more people and wish to be seated together, or if you have any other questions about attending, please contact the Chapel Manager, whose details are printed on page 4.

### from THE DEAN

We begin this academic year, close enough to the constraining and limited conditions of the Covid-19 pandemic, to remain especially appreciative of the opportunities to gather in-person in Chapel and to enjoy the unique combination of music and words, place and intentions that come together in our acts of worship. This term we return to our familiar pattern of services and look forward to hearing from a number of visiting preachers. The Vicar of Little St Mary's, Fr Robert Mackley will be with us on All Saints' Day and Canon Mark Oakley, Dean of St John's will be with us on Remembrance Sunday in the morning.

We are especially looking forward to welcoming the Reverend Kimberly Mannings, Rector of St Mary's in the diocese of Liverpool, to preach on Sunday 6 November. King's has been associated with Prescot since the foundation of the College in 1441. We will develop our relationship significantly this term, both through the Rector's visit and also through the Choir's concert taking place in St Mary's in December: one of the events to celebrate the opening of the Shakespeare North Playhouse in Prescot.

The Vice-Provost, Professor Robin Osborne will be making a contribution to our Matins series of sermons addressing the question 'What is truth?', on Sunday 16 October.

King's Voices will be singing our services on Wednesdays; when this service is Evensong the second reading will be taken from the writings and sermons of Dr Martin Luther King Jr.

Immediately before term began we held a special service to mark the death of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and the accession to the throne of His Majesty King Charles III. Our sense of gratitude to the late Queen and our prayers for the new King will continue in spirit for many weeks to come. This will be succinctly summarised in the change to the second suffrage after the Lord's Prayer at Evensong: O Lord, save the King.

### ORGAN RECITALS

This term we are moving the regular Saturday-evening organ recitals, placing them at 2.30 pm on Sundays, directly before Evensong. Alongside our resident organists we are delighted to welcome Richard Pinel, in his final term as Director of Music at Jesus College; George Herbert joins us from St John's College; and Ben Sheen will visit from Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford. Admission to these recitals is free and all are welcome, as well as to the service immediately following them.

### Music

As usual in the Michaelmas Term, the Choir returns to a busy schedule of services, involving much new repertoire in preparation for the run-up to Christmas. Remembrance Sunday (13 November) sees the return to the repertoire of the Duruflé Requiem, and on Saturday 26 November there will be a rare chance to hear King's College Choir and King's Voices combined. The College will celebrate 50 years of the admission of women undergraduates throughout the year and, also on the last Saturday of November, we will feature a newly commissioned work from alumna Errollyn Wallen, alongside music by Honorary Fellow Judith Weir. I will launch the Concerts at King's series on 14 October with an organ recital, recorded 'as-live' for broadcast on BBC Radio 3; and on 4 November the Academy of Ancient Music returns to Chapel for an all-Mozart concert with the Choir.

King's Voices sings weekly on Wednesdays, under the direction of Ralph Woodward. They will also sing on Tuesday 25 October, during the School half-term holiday.
