INTRODUCTORY NOTICES

ATTENDING CHAPEL SERVICES

We warmly invite members of the public and of other colleges in the University to join us for almost all our choral services. Our services are open to people of all faiths and none, and we enjoy the diversity of the congregations that gather day by day.

Most days, anything up to an hour before a service begins, a queue forms at the main entrance to College. Half an hour before the service, the College gate is opened and the queue moves forward. A quarter of an hour before the service, people are admitted to the Chapel itself. Five minutes before the service begins, the main gate of College is closed and, to ensure a calm and timely start to all our services, any who arrive later are not admitted.

Inside College there are three queues. The queue alongside the Chapel is the main one and is for members of the public. Members of the University are invited to queue on the north side of the Chapel. Only members and staff of King's College and School, and choir families, are invited to queue in front of the Gibbs Building.

When you come to a service, please bear the following four points in mind:

- * We ask you not to bring any bag that is larger than airline hand-luggage size.
- We ask you take a seat in the Ante-chapel if you cannot commit to remaining for the whole service. For Evensong allow up to an hour; for Holy Eucharist an hour and a quarter.
- We do not allow recording or photography of any kind in services and strongly request that phones be turned off.
- * We regret that there are no public toilet facilities available in College.

If you or anyone attending with you has any special needs that we might be able to help you with, or if you are coming in a group of ten or more people and wish to be seated together, or if you have any other questions about attending, please contact the Chapel Manager, whose details are printed on page 5.

from THE DEAN

Michaelmas Term is always very positive and forward-looking in the Chapel. We begin by admitting new Choristers, as well as welcoming new senior members of the Choir, on Sunday 1 October. This year we also have the privilege of welcoming our new Provost, Dr Gillian Tett. We look forward hugely to the contribution that she will make to the life of the Chapel as well as to her leadership of the College.

Ahead of that, on Sunday 24 September, we will hear our outgoing Provost, Professor Michael Proctor, give an address at the Sunday-morning service. Mike has given this for several years, helping to make the service a more widely appreciated part of the alumni weekend. For this and for all his support of the life of the Chapel—and his contributions on occasions great and small, in the public spaces and behind the scenes—we are sincerely grateful.

We have two visiting preachers this term: The Revd Dr Michael Banner, Dean of Trinity College and a familiar voice to those who listen to *Thought for the Day* on BBC Radio 4. Michael will be with us on Remembrance Sunday morning. We also welcome back The Right Revd Paul Ferguson, Bishop of Whitby, on the final Sunday of Term. Paul was a student at King's when he was preparing for ordination at Westcott House and at that time assisted in leading Chapel services as cantor. Unusually for a clergyman and perhaps uniquely for a bishop, he holds a Fellowship of the Royal College of Organists.

Our liturgical week this year reverts to our pre-Covid pattern of eight choral services, with King's Voices singing on Mondays and the choral scholars and lay clerks on Wednesdays.

At evensong on Mondays and Wednesdays, the second reading will be from the poetry of Denise Levertov (1923–77). A convert to Christianity, her work touches on themes such as the spiritual journey, doubt, nothingness and absence, and respect for nature and life.

This term, we also properly welcome to the Chapel team Emily Lyons as our new Chapel Manager. Emily has been working alongside Dr Tim Atkin over the summer—the summer of two Chapel Managers—but, as term begins, so Tim will leave and Emily will become *the* Chapel Manager. We are advertising now for the position of Deputy Chapel Manager.

We are sorry to say goodbye to Tim, who has made a very strong contribution to many aspects of the behind-the-scenes life of the Chapel and who has brought a very pragmatic and positive approach to engaging with others in the preparation and management of our great events. We thank him and wish him well in the future.

Organ recitals

Organ recitals are at 2.30 pm on Sundays, before Evensong. Paul Greally returns for a fourth year as Organ Scholar, and it is a pleasure to welcome former Chorister and first-year organ scholar, Alexander Finlayson-Brown. Benedict Turner-Berry leaves his place as a tenor in the Choir to climb the stairs and play a recital on 22 October. Alongside the home team, it is a pleasure to welcome Katelyn Emerson from Gonville and Caius, and Ophelia Amar, the prize-winning Nicholas Danby Trust Organ Scholar. Admission to these recitals is free and all are welcome, as well as to the service immediately following them.

Music

Concerts at King's starts the new season on 3 November with a performance of Haydn's *Creation*, involving the combined Choirs of King's and New College, Oxford, alongside the Philharmonia Orchestra. On 10 November, the BBC Singers will give a concert, broadcast live on BBC Radio 3, commemorating the tenth anniversary of the death of JohnTavener. Alongside the regular choral services in Chapel, special mention should be given to the Requiem sung to the setting by Duruflé on Remembrance Sunday, and the annual Procession for Advent on Sunday 26 November. Further details about this service can be found on the College website.

King's Voices sings weekly on Mondays, under the direction of Ralph Woodward; they will also sing on Tuesday 24 October during the School half-term holiday. Those interested in auditioning for King's Voices should contact Interim Assistant Director of Music Ralph Woodward via email.
