CHORAL SERVICES

Services are normally sung by King's College Choir on Sundays and from Tuesdays to Saturdays. Services on Mondays are sung by King's Voices, the College's mixed voice choir. Exceptions are listed.

ORGAN RECITALS

Each Saturday during term time there is an organ recital at 6.30 p.m. until 7.15 p.m. Admission is free, and there is a retiring collection.

MUSIC

At Requiem Mass at 6.00 p.m. on Remembrance Sunday (14 November) Mozart's setting will be sung with orchestral accompaniment. The same composer's *Missa brevis K 257* will be heard at the Sung Eucharist on Sunday 31 October, accompanied by the Dante Quartet, and on Christmas morning, accompanied by members of the Johnston family, whose contribution to the Christmas and Easter Eucharists has been valued for many years.

The 50th anniversary of the death of the Hungarian composer, Mátyás Seiber, is marked by the singing of his *Missa brevis* on plainsong themes on Advent Sunday (28 November).

The distinguished American composer, Eric Whitacre, leads a choral workshop on Saturday afternoon, 30 October, and later directs the Choir in two of his anthems at Evensong.

Among this term's organ recitalists is Gordon Stewart. Alongside his appearances as a recitalist, Gordon is active as a valued teacher, and among his former pupils is the senior organ scholar Ben-San Lau.

The College is grateful to the choirs – Eton College Choir, RSCM Voices (South), Clare College Choir and The Syred Consort – who will sing during the period 22–24 October, while the Chapel Choir is in Beijing.

The service begins at 11.00 a.m. and ends at about 12.30 p.m. Apart from those reserved for members of the College and their guests, seats are also available for those who are prepared to queue. The queue is admitted shortly after 10.30 a.m.
