### CHORAL SERVICES

Services are normally sung by King's College Choir on Sundays and from Tuesdays to Saturdays. Services on Mondays are sung by King's Voices, the College's mixed voice choir. Exceptions are listed.

### ORGAN RECITALS

Each Saturday during full term time there is an organ recital at 6.30 p.m. until 7.15 p.m. Admission is free, and there is a retiring collection. There will be no recital on 2 March.

### HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SERVICES

The ninth *Easter at King's* festival takes place this year. Alongside the services a number of concerts take place. Principal among these will be two performances of Bach *St Matthew Passion*, and there will be a rare opportunity to hear Howells *Stabat mater* on Good Friday.

## MUSIC

On Sunday 10 February the Dante Quartet will accompany the Choir in Schubert at the Sung Eucharist. On Saturday 2 March at 5.30 p.m. there will be a memorial evensong for the late Sir Philip Ledger (KC 1956), who read music at King's and was Organist and Director of Music from 1974–1982. The music chosen includes compositions of his own as well as music with which he was particularly associated. Former members of the Choir present will have the opportunity to take part in the canticles, *Walmisley in d minor*.

On Wednesday 13 March, the Choir will perform extracts from a new work written for the College, *lit by holy fire*, by Francis Grier (KC 1973), formerly organ scholar, with words from the Psalter and by Elizabeth Wood.
